



Employment-Based Community Involvement Hours 2023-2023

The Ministry of Education is providing increased flexibility in how secondary students can earn hours.

Any student aged 14 years and older can count up to a maximum of 10 hours from paid employment toward their earned hours at the discretion of the principal. Students counting paid employment towards their graduation requirement are required to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to the service for others.
