PPHS Honouring Identities

- We recognize that this past Friday, November 7, was International Inuit Day, also known as International
 Circumpolar Inuit Day, a day created to honour Inuit and amplify Inuk voices. This day celebrates the rich cultures,
 languages, and resilience of Inuit peoples whose homelands span the Canadian North and the broader circumpolar
 regions. We encourage everyone to take a moment today to learn something new about Inuit people, their lands,
 and their vibrant cultural traditions.
- We also recognize that this past Saturday, November 8, was Indigenous Veterans Day, a day dedicated to honouring the First Nations, Metis, and Inuit peoples who have proudly served in Canada's military. Despite barriers such as language differences, cultural challenges, and long travel from remote communities, more than 4,000 Indigenous members served in the First World War, and by the end of the Second World War over 3,000 First Nations members along with many Metis, Inuit, and other Indigenous recruits had served in uniform. Indigenous service members contributed essential skills such as patience, tracking, and marksmanship. Over 12,000 Indigenous people have served in major conflicts and peacekeeping efforts worldwide, and we carry their stories forward through our collective learning, remembrance, and commitment to truth and reconciliation.
