- Eighteen year old Terry Fox of Port Coquitlam, BC never saw himself as remarkable. But Terry's cancer diagnosis of cancer just above the knee, the subsequent amputation of his leg and experience in the children's cancer wards changed all that. Terry's personal experience and research led him to a simple conclusion more money was needed for cancer research! Before his death on June 28, 1981, Terry had achieved his once unimaginable goal of \$1 from every Canadian. More importantly, he had set in motion the framework for an event, The Terry Fox Run, that would ignite cancer research in Canada, raising more than \$850 million since 1980, and bringing hope and health to millions of Canadians.
